

Background

Initially a Working Group aimed to explore issues related to scientific research data sets that contains human subject information, as well as related datasets that have the potential to be combined in a way that can expose private information.

The goal of the group was to:

- develop a framework for how researchers and repositories should appropriately manage human-subject datasets,
- develop a metadata set to describe the privacy-related aspects of research datasets, and
- build awareness of the privacy implications of research data sharing.

With the aim to:

- 1) Improve the understanding of the privacy issues that relate specifically to research data from distinct stakeholder perspectives.
- 2) Support a worldwide dialogue about the privacy issues that surround the sharing, combination, and reuse of research data.
- 3) Reduce the risk of an unintentional release of personally identifiable information through the sharing or reuse of research data.

Background/update workplan

INITIAL Workplan

To focus on world-wide legal frameworks and the impacts these frameworks have on data sharing, especially with human-subject data.

- A systematic literature review comparing the differences and similarities,
- formulate a set of principles that will provide guidance to the researcher and repository communities on how to govern personal data.
- define a set of use cases on how the principles will be applied.
- Share proposed guidelines for (RDA) endorsement and adoption
